Goal

 Build thriving and sustainable farming operations, farmers and farming communities

Target Audiences

- Hmong farmers
- Latino farmers

Key Approaches

- In-class room presentations
- On-farm 1:1 tutorials
- Videos and manuals
- Demonstration plots

Target Outcomes

- Increase farm income for participating farmers by at least 10-15%
- Increase the # of farmers who write business plans, file Schedule F forms and apply for microloans
- Develop 5 new value added businesses owned and operated by the children of farmers
- Increase new markets beyond \$300,000

Project Accomplishments


31 training sessions from how to grow peach trees in high tunnels to winterizing farm machinery

56 page Spanish and English training manual on post-harvest handling and food safety

Launched a 10 module value added curriculum for immigrant farmers and set up 12 bee hives

Worked with 7 Hmong children of farmers and their value added products and assisted 9 farmers to open IDA accounts and purchase \$52,000 assets

Projected FY 2016 sales in HAFA and LEDC marketing cooperatives are over \$300,000
