- Who can request mediation?
 - USDA-related issues:
 - Agricultural Loans
 - Wetlands determinations
 - Compliance with farm programs, including conservation programs
 - National organic program established under the Organic Foods Production Act of 1990
 - Agricultural Credit
 - Rural water loan programs
 - Grazing on National Forest System land
 - Pesticides
 - Non-USDA issues:
 - Lease issues; including land leases and equipment leases.
 - Family farm transition.
 - Farmer-neighbor disputes

 - Formation of LLCs and sub-chapter S corporations along with the preparation of basic business organizational documents.


