Workshops/Armed to Farm Boot Camps

Agroforestry Academy

- •July 2015 at University of Missouri
- •40% of participants were veterans sponsored through BFRDP Grant
- •Gained knowledge and skills through lectures and hands on experience in agroforestry practices:
- Silvopasture
- Elderberry production
- Alley cropping
- Forest farming
- Marketing



Online Training Programs

- 35 modules available for free in both English and Spanish
- Adding new modules and video

Internships and Hands-on Training

Over 1000 hours logged to date, majority are veteran intern hours



Networking and mentoring services

- Networking session
- Sponsored 46 veteran farmers and spouses for Southern SAWG 2015



Overall Target Outcome

New Farmer Online Training Program

- Initial grant had 24,000 downloads
- Expected to reach 10,000 with current grant

Armed to Farm workshops, on farm demonstration and internship programs

- Expect to train 300 farmers through workshops, internships and demonstrations
- Currently working with 30 beginning and/or veteran farmers through workshops and internships

Networking and mentoring services

- Expected to have 400 individuals participate in conferences and farmer training programs
- Sponsored 46 veteran farmers and spouses for Southern SAWG in Mobile, AL, Jan. 2015
- Opening registration soon to support veterans at 2016 meeting
