

Project Overview

 Project overview —: The primary goal of Arkansas Land and Community Development Corporation (ALCDC) Beginning Farmers and Ranchers Development Program(BFRDP) is to help Socially Disadvantaged/Limited Resource farmers, ranchers and veterans to become successful beginning farmers and ranchers.





- Audience: Minority and limited resource vegetable and livestock producer ranchers, located in Central, Eastern and Southern Arkansas.
- Key Approaches: The program will provide education, training and technical assistance will be provided in five (5) key areas.

 By the end of this project we will have helped 130 BFRs start/improve their farms by ...better farming practices in financial management, conservation resource management and marketing strategies and access to other farm support resources.





Overall target outcome: The Program outcome for the targeted group of farmers, ranchers and veterans are yearly improvements in crop yields and ranch income as a result of the implementation of better farming practices and access to other farm support resources.
